Planning Guide for Celebrating the Sacrament of Matrimony






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Introduction

Procession

Introduction

There are two basic elements of processions for celebrating a wedding within the celebration of the Mass that give rise to three basic forms. One element has the entire wedding party join the priest in the procession that is part of the opening rite of the Mass; or the priest is waiting in the sanctuary to greet the wedding party as they process to the front of the church. The other element is when the priest greets the couple – as a couple – which is dependent upon the first element. Once welcomed by the priest, the couple remains together.

When the expression "the entire wedding party" is used it refers to (in this order) the bridesmaids and groomsmen arm-in-arm, flower girl, ring bearer, the maid of honor and best man, parents of the couple, and the couple themselves.

Form A1 – Priest greets the couple at the doors of the church

The entire wedding party gathers at the doors (inside) of the church. The priest (with cross bearer and altar servers) go there to warmly greet and welcome everyone. After the greeting, a simple procession starts up the aisle with the priest and servers leading the way. They are followed by the entire wedding party. Since the couple has been greeted, the final part of the procession is: parents of the groom, parents of the bride, followed by the bride and groom together.

The wedding party moves into their assigned pews, the best man escorts the maid of honor to her place in the sanctuary, followed by the groom escorting the bride to her place in the sanctuary.

Form A2 – Priest greets the couple and the entire wedding party at the sanctuary/altar rail

The entire wedding party assembles at the doors (inside) of the church. They process down the aisle as above, except the groom processes with his parents, followed by the bride with her parents.

The groomsmen and bridesmaids move into their assigned pews; the best man escorts the maid of honor to her place in the sanctuary; and the flower girl/ring bearer take their places in the pew.

The parents of the groom move into their pew while the groom waits at altar rail. The groom meets the bride and her father and mother. The parents of the bride kiss her and place her hand in the hand of the groom who escorts her into the sanctuary.

Once the entire wedding party has taken their places, the priest (already in the sanctuary) warmly greets and welcomes the couple.

Form A3 – Priest and groom greet the bride at the sanctuary/altar rail after a procession

In this form, the entire wedding party is not assembled together. Here the priest, groom, and groomsmen process from the sacristy. The groom and groomsmen take their places in front of the first pew and await the procession. The procession order is: bridesmaids, maid of honor, flower girl, ring bearer, bride escorted by her father (or father and mother). The groomsmen meet the bridesmaids after which they move into their pews. The best man meets the maid of honor and escorts her to her place in the sanctuary. The flower girl/ring bearer take their places in the pew. The groom meets the bride and her father (and mother). The parent(s) of the bride kiss her and place her hand in the hand of the groom who escorts her into the sanctuary.

Once the entire wedding party has taken their places, the priest (already in the sanctuary) warmly greets and welcomes the couple.

Introduction to the Readings

We invite the bride and groom to prayerfully select the readings from Sacred Scripture as part of the planning for their wedding day.

Please see the Sacred Heart website for the wide selection of readings from the Old Testament, New Testament, and Gospels. It is usual to select one from each section. The individual readings and brief commentaries about each reading are on the website.

It is also a great opportunity to invite Catholic family members/guests to participate in the celebration as a reader.

On the Ceremony Planner, you will find a matrix. That matrix is intended to help guide you in one aspect of choosing your readings. At least one of your selections of the three readings must be marked with an asterisk (*). This is to ensure at least one of the readings specifically speaks to marriage.

There are some days in which you may not have a choice of the readings – these are not days on which people normally celebrate weddings – e.g., Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter (or the following eight days), on Solemnities such as the Feast of the Sacred Heart, on All Souls' Day, on Ash Wednesday, and during Holy Week, and on Holy Days of Obligation. It is still permissible to celebrate Marriages on these days (except on Good Friday and Holy Saturday), but the assigned prayers and readings of the day's Mass must be used.

Once you've chosen which form of the vows to use in your celebration, you then pick the manner in which you will exchange your vows:

- 1. The couple have memorized their vows;
- 2. The priest (with mic turned off) leads them through the vows, as the couple repeat after the priest;
- 3. The vow becomes a question with a response from the couple of "I do."
