SACRED HEART THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD 16 May 2021

In the Acts of the Apostles we hear words of Jesus and about events related also in all the Gospels (except John), but with some added details: Jesus' promise of the coming of the Spirit, and the two angels who reproach the apostles for staring up to heaven in an effort to see the departed Jesus. There is a further reproach in verses omitted from today's gospel. Jesus reproached the apostles for their incredulity and obstinate refusal to believe reports that he is indeed risen. Finally comes the commission to go out and preach to all creation, and the ascension itself.

We might choose to take serious notice of Jesus' reproach too in our own lives. The expectation of 2R that we 'live in a manner worthy of the call' doesn't only mean regular attendance at Mass but it also means being the person of Christ in our daily encounters in the world beyond the walls of our church. We can be confident in such action because we know that Christ is with us always.

Perhaps the following quote from George MacLeod of Scotland, founder of the lona Community, may be pertinent ...

'So we bless you for this place, for your directing of us, your redeeming of us, and your indwelling. Take us outside, Lord. Outside holiness, out to where the soldiers gamble, and the thieves curse, and the nations clash at the cross-roads of the world...

So shall this building continue to be justified.'

We come to Mass to praise God but also to re-connect, to remind ourselves of the person of Jesus whom we are called to imitate during the week.
