SACRED HEART 17th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 25 July 2021

The Gospel today could be a continuation of Mark 6:35 as last week, but it develops into something much bigger. It begins in the same way as Mark, with the miracle of the loaves and fishes. John's account differs in some ways: John mentions that it was shortly before the Passover. The dialogue between Jesus and named disciples, Philip (who is being tested by Jesus but does not realize it) and Andrew, is not in Mark, nor is the small boy with the loaves and fishes. Finally the comment of the people afterwards, 'This is truly the prophet, the one who is to come into the world' and the reaction of Jesus to escape to the hills to avoid being made king, are only found in John. What he does not say is the number of people. This whole chapter is John's account of the Eucharist, which is missing from his Last Supper narrative.

In 1R we find a parallel incident in the story of Elisha, who had succeeded Elijah as a prophet. This took place during a famine, so the need for food was more urgent, unlike in the Gospel. There is the same doubt about what is being asked twenty loaves between a hundred men? - but the same confidence, subsequently fulfilled, that God will provide.

2R is a famous passage from Ephesians, about the unity there must be among us. We could add, 'one bread, one body."
