SACRED HEART 19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 8 August 2021

Some verses have been omitted from today's Gospel (John 6) so the words that people are complaining about haven't actually been heard, until they are repeated in Jesus's discourse today. He is getting more demanding in what he asks people to believe - the infant Christian community was feeling the opposition from those unbelievers of the Jews who had not accepted Jesus. Today he speaks of himself as the way to the Father, and that it is necessary to believe in him to know the Father and have eternal life. He ends this passage by claiming to be the new manna, but not perishable like that food, and adds that this bread is his flesh for the life of the world. How that claim is received, we would have to wait until next week to see, except that the Assumption replaces it!

1R is another story of miraculous feeding by the Lord - actual food which nourishes physically, but which does not bring eternal life.

The psalm begins a three-week use of this thanksgiving song which we naturally connect with the Eucharist but the writer of the psalm could not have known about this. Instead it teaches that a righteous life will be blessed and that all classes of people can call on God and will be rescued.

2R is a lesson which can be learned by Christians at any time: our behavior to each other must reflect the kindness that God has shown us in Christ, who gave himself 'as a fragrant offering and a sacrifice.'
