The Transfer of the Most Blessed Sacrament

*You are invited to follow the Blessed Sacrament as it is carried outside in procession and back to the Altar of Repose.

During the procession, verses 1-4 of **"Pange Lingua"** are sung:

Sing, my tongue, the Savior's glory,
of his flesh the myst'ry sing:
of the Blood, all price exceeding,
shed by our immortal King,
destined for the world's redemption,
from a noble womb to spring.

Of a pure and spotless virgin

When you come into your kingdom.

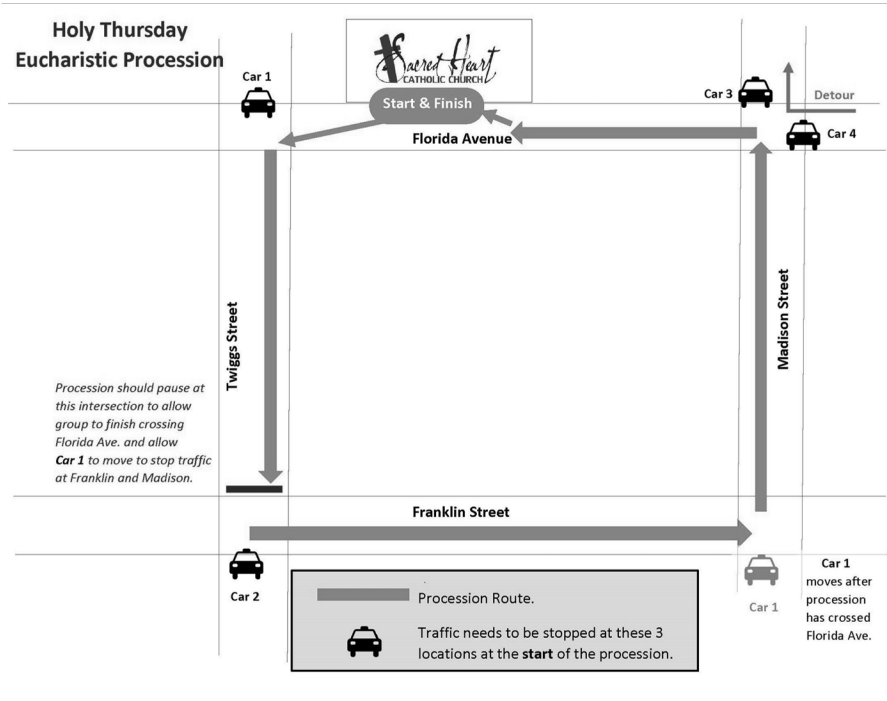
*As the procession reaches the Altar of Repose, the priest incenses the Blessed Sacrament, while verses 5&6 of **"Pange Lingua"** are sung.
