# Our Inspiration **St. Vincent de Paul**

(1581 - 1660) Founder of the Congregation of the Mission, Daughters of Charity, Confraternities of Charity, and Ladies of Charity.

A man of deep faith, keen intellect, and enormous creativity, St. Vincent de Paul has become known as the **"The Apostle of Charity"** and **"Father of the Poor."** His contributions to the training of priests and organizing parish missions and other services for the poor shaped the Church's role in the modern world.

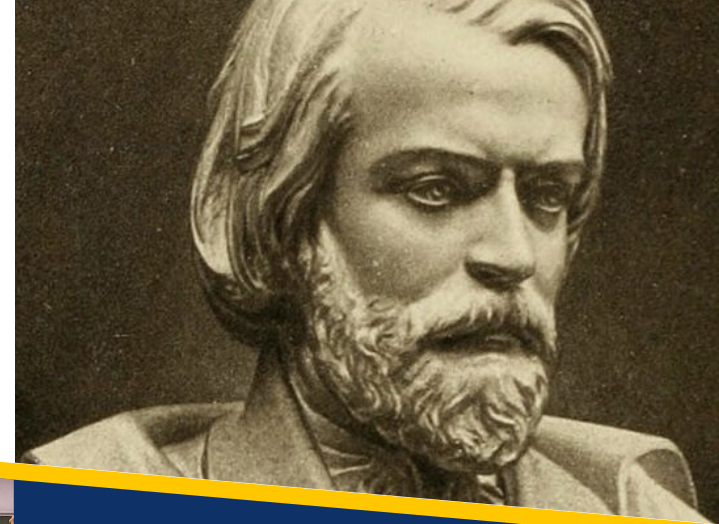

## Origins of the Society **Blessed Frédéric Ozanam**

(1813 - 1853) Founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Frédéric was a husband, father, professor, and servant of the poor.

He founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul as a young student with others of the Sorbonne in Paris in response to taunts for Catholics to "practice what they preach." Ozanam and his fellow students began to seek out and visit with the poor and marginalized in their homes, providing them with food and clothing, in addition to their friendship and concern.

His group later took St. Vincent de Paul as their patron. Frédéric's writings on social justice anticipated the first social encyclical of our modern times, *Rerum Novarum*, published by Pope Leo XIII in 1891.
