faith its lesson quickly learns.

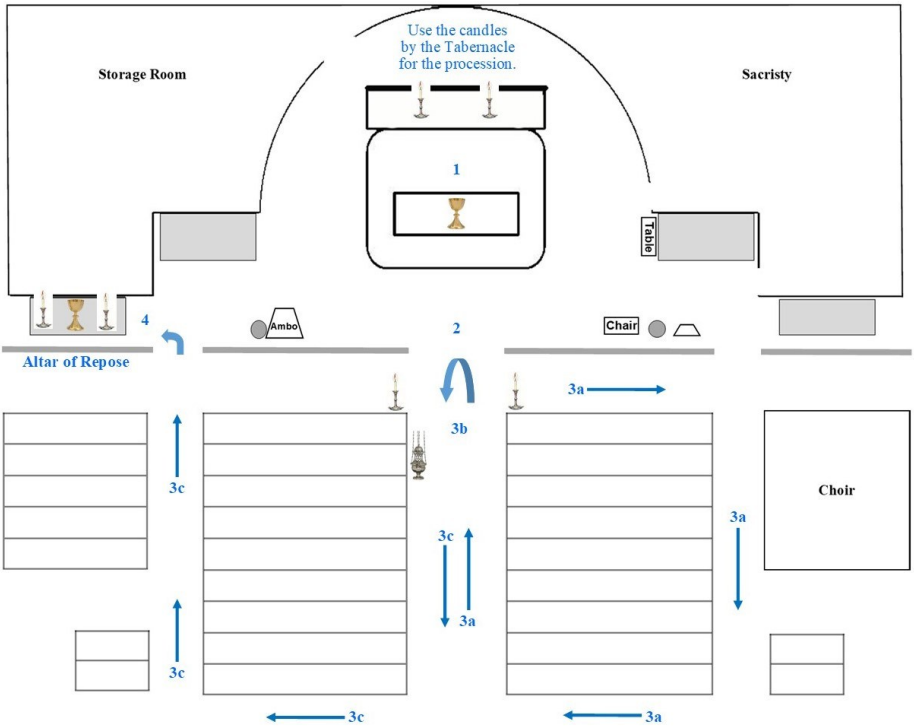
As the procession reaches the Altar of Repose, the priest incenses the Blessed Sacrament, while verses 5&6 of "Pange Lingua" are sung.
